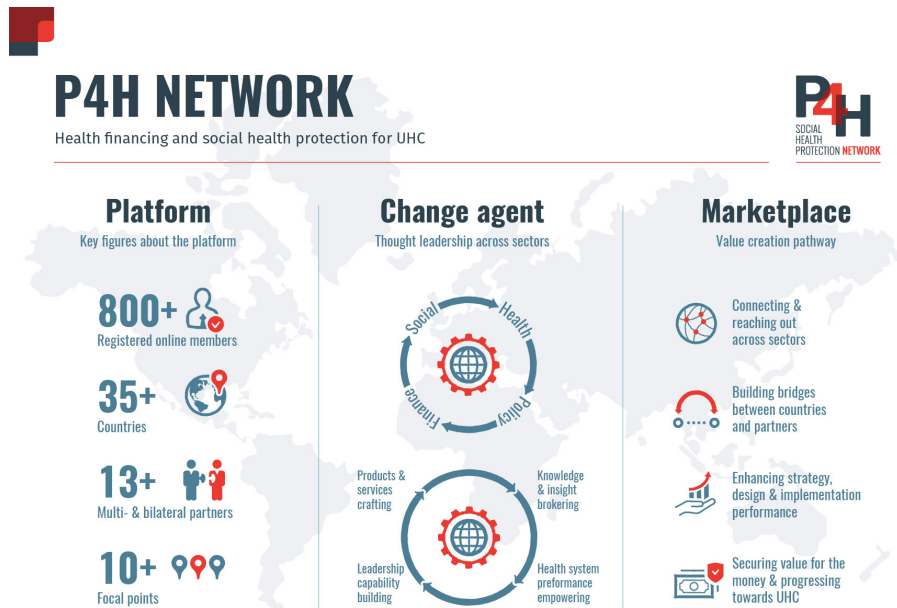

Contextualisation

The P4H Network in a nutshell

- P4H is the global network for health financing & economics and social health protection. It aims at promoting equitable and sustainable health systems to progress towards Universal Health Coverage
- As of January 2018, the Network comprises of 13 member organizations: the World Health Organization (WHO), the World Bank (WB), the International Labour Organization (ILO), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the Asian Development Bank (ADB), the Global Fund (GF), France, Germany, Kazakhstan, Morocco, Spain, Switzerland and the USA.
- These member organizations are committed to collaborating at global, regional and country levels in the area of health financing and economics and social health protection for UHC.

- The complexity of the P4H Network’s remit stems from the idiosyncratic multidimensional nature of the thematic areas which P4H specialises in: multiple stakeholders, policy span across sectors and beyond health and social protection are but a few of the challenges that the P4H team needs to factor in, in order to strive for effectiveness.

What you need to know about the TCG

- The TCG is one of the governance groups of the P4H Network for health financing & economics and social health protection. As such, it has a large ambit and its scope of engagement spans:
 - Preparation of the work plan and information of the Steering Group of the Network
 - Design of practical collaborations between member organizations
 - Insight in key trends across the health, social and finance sectors
 - Exploration of new technical and/or methodological avenues to be cleared by the Steering Group, thus paving the way for new activity or product development.

- In practice, the Technical Co-ordination Group endorses a variety of roles. Empirically, the TCG meets on average once a year and focuses mainly on the preparation of the strategic orientation to be cleared by Steering Group members;
- In accordance with its terms of reference, i.e. the founding charter of the P4H Network for health financing & economics and social health protection, the P4H governing bodies comprise of a Steering Group and a Technical Co-ordination group. Provisions 10.1.1 and 10.1.2 of the aforementioned terms of reference (amended 2018 version) specify that:



10.1.1. The Steering Group is responsible for strategic guidance and orientation; policy, advocacy and enhanced political support; oversight and ensuring coherence and complementarities between P4H and other initiatives and partners. Partners, who have opted for full participation (provision 9.3, option C). All members are expected to designate a SG member at global level. The SG meets once a year or upon request.

When the network will reach 15 partners, the Steering Group membership will be revised towards a constituency based model (to be determined during the SG meeting in Paris in June 2018).

10.1.2. The Technical Coordination Group (comprising GFPs, Coordination Desk, P4H RFP / CFP country level coordinators/advisors and implementation level as appropriate) is responsible for the coordination and facilitation of technical assistance at country level as appropriate; advocacy and communication; exploring, identification and facilitation of domestic and international funding



- Customarily, P4H Network member organizations designate one representative to participate to the TCG meetings. These representatives are different from the officials of member organizations sitting on the P4H Steering Group.
- The P4H Network Co-ordination Desk is entrusted with the facilitation of the TCG meetings and proceedings (agenda definition; meetings moderation; and minutes' preparation).
