Health care utilisation of persons with disabilities in Cambodia: An analysis of the Cambodia Demographic Health Survey 2014

Summary

“[...] This report presents findings on the health care utilisation of persons with disabilities in Cambodia, generated from the 2014 version of the Cambodia Demographic and Health Survey which adopts for the first time an internationally standardised measure of disability known as the Washington Group Short-set questionnaire.[...] Overall, the findings suggest that persons with disabilities in Cambodia experience higher needs and lower capacity to pay for the health care relative to the population without disabilities.”
