


Comparative regional analysis

Financial protection is strongest where out-of-pocket payments are close to or <15% of health spending


Improve coverage design



Expand benefit package to outpatient medicines




Use low, fixed copayments instead of percentage payments



Increase public spending on health

The out-of-pocket payment share of current health spending is generally lower in countries that spend relatively more publicly on health Although fiscal capacity is more limited in middle-income countries, governments in countries in all income groups have choices





Characteristics of a well-designed health financing policy

- 1. Government budget prioritizes health spending
- 2. Broad public revenue base for the health system
- 3. Access to health services does not depend on health insurance status
- 4. Co-payment policy to protect people at risk of poverty or social exclusion and people with chronic conditions
- 5. Benefit package includes priority outpatient medicines
