P4H Asia Network Newsletter - May 2022



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The P4H Network is a global health network aimed at improving social health protection (SHP) and strengthening health financing (HF) systems to promote universal health coverage (UHC) in low- and middle-income countries. In 2017, P4H created the Asia Network for Health Financing and Protection (ANHFP). Eighteen countries came together to discuss common policy issues and experiences, best practices and lessons learned in SHP and HF for UHC. Key principles – communication, joint advocacy, collaboration and inclusiveness – guide the P4H Network.

Expert Speaks



For this edition of the newsletter, we invited Professor Soonman Kwon to share his insights on the development of SHP and HF to advance UHC in Asia. Soonman is a professor and former dean of the School of Public Health, Seoul National University, Republic of Korea. He has held visiting positions at the Harvard School of Public Health, London School of Economics, University of Toronto, Peking University and the University of Bremen.

Speaking on the development of health financing and social health protection in Asia during the pandemic, Soonman states, "Many countries in Asia rapidly expanded SHP and HF in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The pandemic helped governments (especially the ministries of finance) better appreciate the importance of health system resilience, the necessity of investment in the health system and pandemic preparedness, and the interconnectedness of health and economy. Investment in strengthening health systems and UHC is a fundamental prerequisite for pandemic preparedness and response."

"Flexibility and accountability of government budgets (or public financial management) are key to allocating more financial resources to the health sector during a pandemic."

"UHC ensures access not only to individual services but also to public health services, e.g. prevention, preparedness and treatment of infectious diseases and pandemics. Governance is also important for the effective response to COVID-19, including the cooperation of public

and private sectors, central and local governments, and ministries across and within sectors."

Speaking on P4H's role in regional development, he says, "P4H Network is an effective way for countries to learn from each other. The <u>P4H platform</u> can provide knowledge and policy experience more rapidly than conventional methods. Based on experiences shared by other countries, each country can craft its own policies, taking into account its local contexts.

Highlights of the Month

In April 2022, P4H Network tweets highlighted the importance of investment in primary health care (PHC) with adequate financing to enable effective primary care functions during the pandemic.

The International Labour Organization (ILO) presented and discussed its Country Brief series on the SHP landscape and progress in Asia and the Pacific at the P4H Technical Exchange Group meeting. It focused on selected countries like Mongolia and their partnerships with the CONNECT Network. At the P4H webinar focused on CIS communities, Central Asian countries Tajikistan and Uzbekistan shared their mandatory health insurance reforms and experiences.

In Japan, COVID-19 financing remained robust, providing budget support for global vaccine initiatives and releasing an emergency relief package for those who fell under the poverty level in recent years. In Ho Chi Minh City, Viet Nam, exhaustion from the long fight against COVID-19, along with low pay, resulted in the turnover of more than a thousand health workers.

Several publications and events this past month documented social protection gaps in Asia. Bangladesh's high out-of-pocket payments remained persistent. Benefit incidence analysis of hospital unit costs in Indonesia revealed regional variations, reflecting inequality of access. India's webinar and panel discussion highlighted the challenges to reach health insurance coverage for the non-poor or 'missing middle' population.

As COVID-19 widens social protection gaps among countries in Asia, policy dialogues and partnership collaboration on SHP and HF to advance UHC remain important in Asia and the Pacific.

Emergency relief package for low-income households in Japan (20 Apr 2022)



The Japanese government has decided to provide ¥100,000 (USD 774) to newly cash-strapped households as part of an emergency relief package. This package will be funded from the last fiscal year's extra budget and reserve funds.
