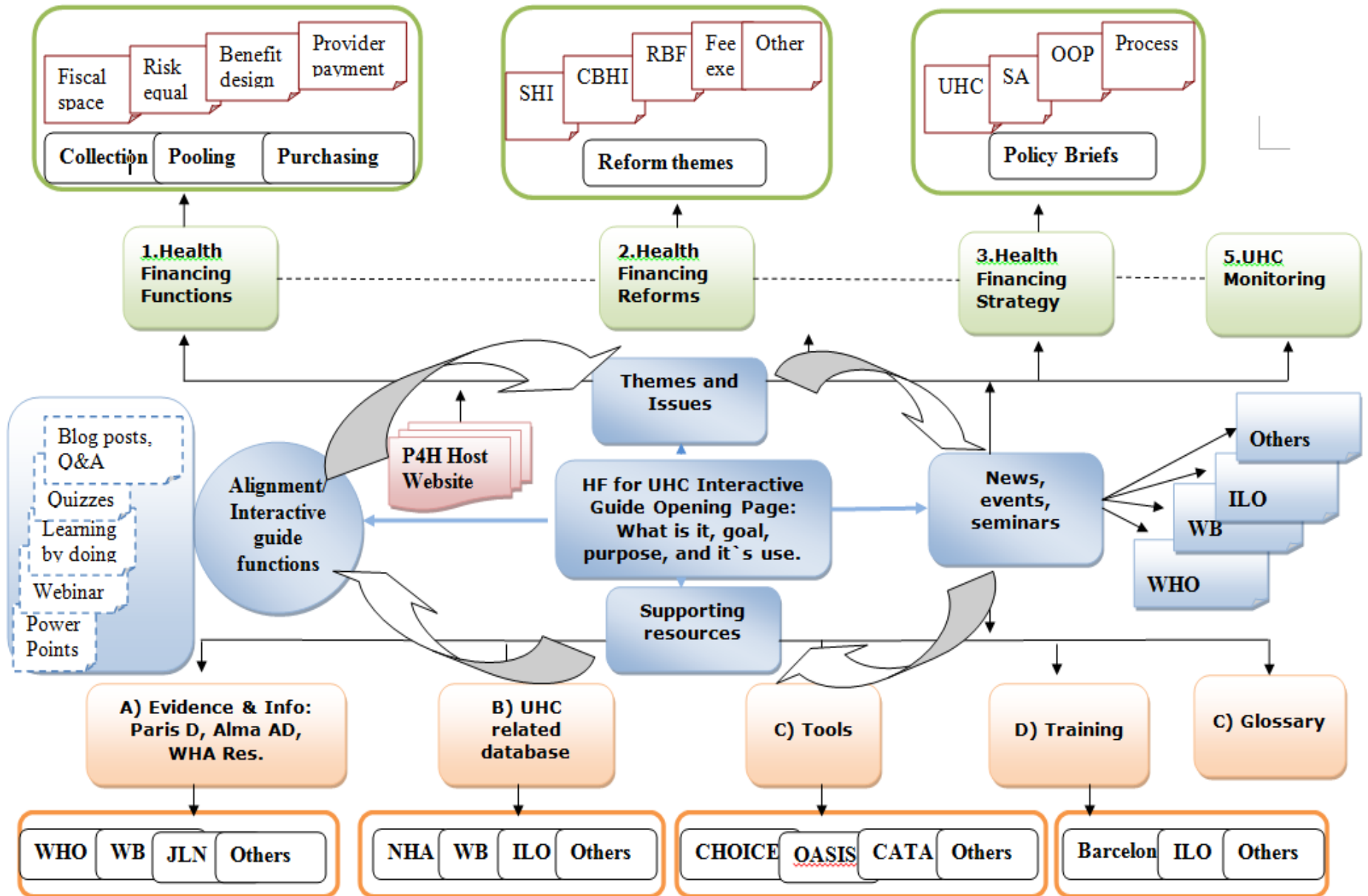
Interactive Guide to UHC

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Project objective and output

- ✓ **Objective:** To develop a web-based Interactive Guide as a platform for UHC policy advise, reform, evidence, capacity building, and partnership.
- ✓ **Output:**
 - Conceptualization of online UHC knowledge resource guide.
 - Systematic overview and structuring of web-based resources on UHC.
 - IT platform capable to support and maintain (via P4H webpage).
 - Support events (meeting follow-up, e-learning).
 - Training (flagship courses and training materials, WBI-WHO)
- ✓ **Funding:** GIZ.

Conceptualisation



Development of thematic materials

Health financing policy team is working on thematic materials and documents for web-posting.

- Introduction/definition of the theme issue, what is it, why is it important for any topic. For example, definition and importance of HF functions and reform themes such as SHI, RBF, etc.
- Frequently asked policy and technical questions, (10 questions under each theme issue).
- Related policy briefs, evidence, training materials, presentations and important web links.

Comprehensive review of web-based resources

UHC relevant web-based materials are being reviewed, collected and structured in a systematic way, including a search function.

- Database (e.g. GHE).
- Analytical tools (e.g. CHOICE; OASIS).
- Training courses (e.g. Flagship course in Barcelona; Kenya; Turin).
- Courses and e-learning opportunities.

Interactive features

- Kenya knowledge exchange forum (P4H, 2013) follow-up:



Questionnaire developed and sent to 13 country participants (WBI-WHO).

- Most suited, valued and preferred types of follow-up.
- Opinions and suggestions on effective interactive modes.
- Needed policy and technical support.

Work in progress (June-November 2014)

Action points to complete the project:

- Finalise thematic materials, and documents for web posting (HFP team).
- Screen and prioritise web-based resources being collected and structured (HFP Team).
- Further develop and agree on interactive features, which are responsive, active, manageable, and sustainable e.g. blog posts, Q&A, webinar, and others (HFP Team, WBI and country experts, users and beneficiaries).
- Pilot video-conference based on policy dialogue events (WHO, WBI).
- Finalise web-design, locate, test and activate the web page (WHO, P4H/CD, web and IT experts).
